THE NORTHERN SHUSWAP TREATY SOCIETY HIRES NEW NEGOTIATOR

The Northern Shuswap Treaty Society (NSTS) have hired Jim Doswell, a former Chief Federal Negotiator and Assistant Deputy Minister for the Ministry of Tourism, Recreation and Culture for the Province of British Columbia.

Jim Doswell is an experienced negotiator, having either been working in economic development or negotiating for over 30 years. His experience in negotiating land claims extends even to Honduras. He currently sits as president for the Maltwood Development Group, which has been working as a bridge between First Nations and economic development for over a decade. For the last seven years, Doswell worked as a Chief Federal Negotiator. In addition to his extensive experience in dealing with aboriginal rights and title, he has sat on several boards and committees, that were either economic, health or education focused.

Jim Doswell has been married for 30 years and has one daughter and one grandchild and, for hobbies, enjoys photography, cooking, horse-riding and motorcycle travel. He has been contracted by the Northern Shuswap Treaty Society from June 11th to November 30th, 2007, after which he may receive an extension to early next year.
